The Ministry of Aliyah and Integration is responsible for the assistance given by the State of Israel to new immigrants* and returning residents, from the first organizational stage until your absorption and integration into all spheres of life in Israeli society.

This brochure concentrates the information that you need, prior to arrival in Israel and during your initial days in the country, in order for you to benefit from all the services you are entitled to.

*Those who are recognized as new immigrants, immigrant citizens, and returning minors.

Required Documents When Making Aliyah to Israel

Make Sure You Have The following Documents With You and Not in Your Luggage

- Valid passport with new-immigrant visa (if the passport on which the new-immigrant visa was stamped has expired, one should present a new-immigrant visa in addition to the valid passport).





- **Original public documents, with a notarized translation, authenticated with an “apostille” stamp, or authenticated in accordance with the “chain of signatures” regulation:**

- Birth certificate (the original one). (Only an original birth certificate from countries of the former Soviet Union issued before 1998, does not require authentication).
- A current document that is proof of a change of name – If a change of name was carried out (private name/ family name).
- A current document that is proof of **current family status** issued during the past half year, for example: a marriage certificate, an authorization of divorce, a death certificate of spouse, a document proving personal status for unmarried people, and so forth.

If necessary, it is possible that further documentation will be required regarding the **personal status prior to the present one**. Insofar as it is a country that issues a document that proves previous personal status, a legally authenticated document will be requested as mentioned above. In the case of a country that does not issue a document regarding previous personal status, the applicant should provide a notarized statement regarding his/ her previous personal status signed in the presence of an Israeli consul abroad/ a notary abroad/ a notary in Israel/ a consul of the country of origin of the foreigner who is in Israel.

- A document confirming that there is no previous criminal record: an official document from the country of origin (including also changes of name) that was issued during the past half year confirming that the applicant has no previous criminal record or any criminal convictions. If necessary a federal character reference or document from the region of the invitee will be required, depending on the matter.

- Original documents proving one’s **Judaism and/ or eligibility in accordance with the law of return.**

- Registration as “born” – if one of the members of the couple is Israeli, and they had children born abroad who were not registered as “born” in an official Israeli mission abroad, when registering at the Population and Immigration Authority, one should provide a **birth confirmation** from the maternity hospital that the mother is the woman who gave birth to the child and an original and authenticated **birth certificate**.

Please note, the Population and Immigration Authority has the authority to demand additional documents according to its judgment.

- An official document certifying authorization of guardianship (if necessary) for a relative who made aliyah with you, with an “apostille” stamp.
- Letter from an aliyah emissary (shaliach) – if you have a letter, any other documents that can verify your situation and you believe are relevant.



Upon Arrival at Ben Gurion Airport, You Will Find the Following Services:

Individual Guidance – before passport control a representative of the Ministry of Aliyah and Integration will meet you in order to guide you through the process. In the event that a representative does not meet you, go to the Passport Control area, Border Control, or the Information Desk at the luggage claim area, and you can receive assistance locating the Ministry representative.

Light refreshments, a nurse, a mother-and-baby room, and telephone calls within Israel – at the Area of Absorption Facilities of the Ministry of Aliyah and Integration (*Mitham HaKlita*) at the Airport.

New Documents – At our office at Ben Gurion airport we will issue you - a new-immigrant certificate (*te'udat oleh*) or an eligibility certificate for a family (*te'udat zakaut*) (single children up to the age of 21 are listed in the eligibility certificate for a family) and a temporary identification card or a registration form for the Population and Immigration Authority. You will also receive an authorization of registration for a Health Fund, and a form for opening a bank account.

Absorption Basket – this is a financial assistance for daily needs during the first six months in Israel. The assistance is in 7 payments. Persons eligible for the Absorption Basket receive the first installment in cash at the airport.

Health Insurance and Health Fund – being new immigrants, you are eligible for national health insurance from the date of receipt of new-immigrant status. In order to realize this right, it is necessary to register in one of the health funds of your choice. Registering in a health fund can be done at the airport by an absorption counselor at no cost, or at one of the branches of the Postal Bank located throughout the country (for a symbolic fee and in the presence of both spouses). After 3 weeks from receipt of new-immigrant status, registration is also through the website of the National Insurance Institute, free of charge. We recommend that you decide the health fund you wish to join before your aliyah. Note that you must register within 90 days of your date of aliyah. Following this period, registration is through a branch office of the National Insurance Institute.

Your Baggage – at the conclusion of all procedures, you can collect your luggage, accompanied by a representative of the Ministry of Aliyah and Integration.

Free Transport from the Airport – you are eligible for one-time free transport from the airport, along with your luggage, to the destination of your choice. Note: if the destination is Eilat or environs, and you wish to arrive by air, please notify an aliyah emissary (*shaliach*) at least two weeks in advance of your aliyah.

Your First Home in Israel

When you arrive in Israel you have the option of staying with friends or relatives, or in an apartment you have rented or purchased in advance. If you wish to participate in a Jewish Agency absorption program, such as an absorption center, “Bayit Rishon BeMoledet”, or similar program, you must arrange this with the Jewish Agency prior to aliyah.

What Activities are Necessary During the First Days in Israel?

Opening a Bank Account – You must open a bank account in Israeli currency, and it is recommended to do so as soon as possible, so that we can transfer the assistance you are entitled to, and the allowances of the National Insurance Institute will be transferred to it, if you are entitled to them. Both spouses must be present when opening a bank account, and the account has to be under both their names. If one spouse is unable to come to the bank when opening the account, it is necessary to bring a notarized power-of-attorney. In order to open a bank account you must bring your *te'udat zehut* and *te'udat oleh**.

Note that many banks require an income-tax file number when opening a bank account. In the United States: SSN, in Russia: INN, in the rest of the world: TIN (Tax Identification Number).

Note that you must make a one-time deposit of at least one shekel in order for the bank account to become active and to enable the Ministry to transfer financial assistance without difficulty.

After opening the account, you must return to the Ministry of Aliyah and Integration and give the absorption counselor the form you received at the airport with the details of your bank account, signed by the bank, in order to receive financial assistance into the account. It is advisable to bring with you a verification of a deposit.

Whom to consult?

Your choice of commercial banks throughout the country. It is recommended to visit a bank branch close to your place of residence.

* By law, a *te'udat oleh* is used as a *te'udat zehut* for up to 30 days from the date of issue.





Consultation at the Ministry of Aliyah and Integration – we will be happy to welcome you at our offices in order to provide you with the information that you need about the Absorption Basket or assured income (a living allowance [dmei kiyum]), employment assistance, educational options for your children, information about Hebrew ulpan study, and other forms of Ministry assistance, such as rental subsidies.

In order to transfer assistance payments to which you are entitled from the Ministry, please supply the personal absorption counselor with verification of opening a bank account. It is advisable to bring a verification of a deposit that verifies that the account is active.

Whom to consult?

Registration for Hebrew Study – knowledge of Hebrew is essential for successful absorption, and it is worthwhile to study the language during the first months following aliyah. More information is on page 13 of this brochure.





Requesting a te'udat zehut and Israeli passport – Upon arrival at Ben Gurion airport it is likely that you received a temporary *te'udat zehut*, valid for nine months, from a representative of the Ministry of Aliyah and Integration who is authorized by the Population and Immigration Authority. If you do not receive a temporary *te'udat zehut* from the Ministry of Aliyah and Integration at the airport, you receive an Authorization of Registration in the Population Registry, which you can bring to an office of the Population and Immigration Authority in order to receive a permanent *te'udat zehut*.

In order to receive a passport or permanent *te'udat zehut*, it is necessary to make an appointment in advance: on the Population Authority website or through the app or website of [myVisit](https://myvisit.gov.il) or by phone *3450. In Israel biometric documents are issued. The issuance of a passport involves the payment of a fee. The passport or *te'udat zehut* will be sent to you by mail within 3 weeks.

When you visit the Population Authority, you must have the following documents: a foreign passport, *te'udat oleh*, temporary *te'udat zehut* or authorization of registration in the Population Registry, birth certificates with an "apostille" stamp, documents that are proof of eligibility according to the law of return, and if necessary – a marriage certificate, certificate of divorce, or death of spouse with an "apostille" stamp, other documents that are relevant.

Converting a foreign driver's license to an Israeli license – New immigrants are permitted to drive in Israel using a valid overseas license for one year only following the date of entry into the country. Afterwards, they can convert the foreign driver's license to an Israeli license depending on the following conditions:

- Within 5 years from the date of receiving the status of a new immigrant (*oleh*).
- On condition that the foreign license has been valid for at least 5 years in the country of origin before receiving the status of a new immigrant (*oleh*). If the license has not been valid for five years before receiving the status of a new immigrant, please turn to the Ministry of Transport.
- It is necessary to have a notary who speaks the language translate and notarize foreign licenses that are not in English and sign them.
- One must be present during the request for the service.

The conversion procedure is as follows:

- Filling in an online form for issuing a driver's license.
- Visiting an authorized photography center in order to issue a photograph for the driver's license.
- Arrival in person at the licensing bureau. One must arrange an appointment in advance through the app or website

of [myVisit](#) . One must present a new-immigrant certificate (*te'udat oleh*) and a valid driver's license, which has been valid for at least 5 years in the country of origin. One should present only original documents. You will receive a temporary driver's license at the licensing bureau. One must enquire in advance at what branches of the bureau the service of license conversion is available.

- Payment of fee - options for payment: With a credit card via the online government payment service (Sherut Hatashlumim Hamemshalti) at the self-service stations, at the Israel postal service, at a bank, or through the Ministry of Transportation Information Line *5678.
 - Owners of a foreign credit card can pay the fee only at the Israel postal service.
 - After paying the fee, the permanent license will be mailed to the address that is registered in the Population and Immigration Authority.

Assured Income (a living allowance [dmei kiyum])

A new immigrant or family may be eligible for “assured-income” (a living allowance [dmei kiyum]) from the Ministry of Aliyah and Integration at the conclusion of the Absorption Basket payments, until the end of the first year of aliyah. The assistance is provided to those who are not working, and it is possible that an oleh or a family that for various reasons were not found to be eligible for the Absorption Basket, according to the Absorption Basket regulation, will be found to be eligible for this assistance already from the beginning of the first year. You can receive details and conditions of eligibility during the first meeting with your personal absorption counselor.

Allowances from the National Insurance Institute

Child Allowances – Once you have supplied your bank account details to a personal absorption counselor, the information is transmitted to the National Insurance Institute in order for you to receive a child allowance into your bank account. If you do not receive the allowance, consult the National Insurance Institute immediately.

Senior Citizen Allowance or Special Senior Citizen Benefit – For details and for examining your eligibility consult with the National Insurance Institute. In order to investigate eligibility, bring the following documents: *te'udat zehut* or form of Authorization of Registration in the Population Registry, *te'udat oleh*, and documents that attest to your income.

Health insurance and registering for a health fund	<p>Every citizen of Israel is insured for health coverage under the provisions of the National Health Insurance Law. A new immigrant (including a returning minor or an immigrant citizen) who is not working who has no other source of income, or whose income is lower than the sum set by the National Insurance Institute, is eligible for an exemption from health insurance premiums for six months from the date of aliyah to Israel. It is possible to receive an exemption for another six months (twelve months altogether) on condition that the new immigrant has no other source of income as mentioned above, and on a further condition that the new immigrant is receiving assured income from the Ministry of Aliyah and Integration. To actualize the additional six months benefit, you must provide the National Insurance Institute with confirmation of a receipt of assured income (from the Ministry of Aliyah and Integration). The additional exemption will be given only for those months in which assured income was paid. In order to receive health services, one must sign up to one of the health funds. This can be done at Ben Gurion Airport or a Post Office branch or the website of the National Insurance Institute. Registration of children until the age of 3 in a day-care center or a nursery under government supervision is done on the Ministry of Labor website. Registration of children in kindergarten and elementary school takes place at the regional councils. Registration for high school is through the regional council or through the school itself, depending on the council. It is usually possible to register online. Assured income (a living allowance [dmei kiyum])	Following the cessation of Absorption Basket payments, and during the first year, you can be eligible for assured income (a living allowance [dmei kiyum]) payments from the Ministry of Aliyah and Integration. Coordinators for New Immigrants at the Local Authorities

The Ministry of Aliyah and Integration provides support to local authorities for hiring local aliyah coordinators (proyectorim). The coordinators can communicate with you in your native language, are at your disposal in most local authorities and their main task is to guide you during all the initial stages of absorption so your integration can be easier.

The coordinators serve as intermediaries between the olim and specialized departments in the local authorities, government offices and different organizations. The coordinator will provide you information about different subjects and will help you with different processes: registering in an Hebrew Ulpan, registering your children in different educational frameworks, searching for a job etc. The coordinator's aid will direct you to the right places and will spare you from wasting time.
